If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 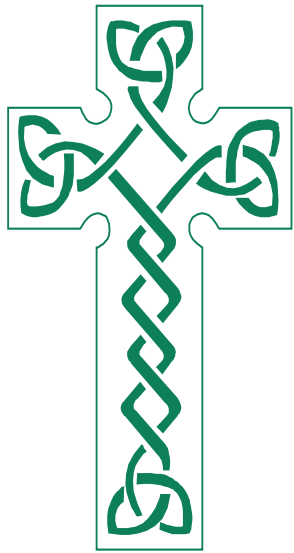

Walking invites us to be open to God who is on the journey with us. There will also be stations around the outer perimeter of the labyrinth for reflection. There is a special Scripture and reflection for each day of Holy Week.

We renew our baptismal life as we see again the battle that God in Christ wins against all the powers of darkness and destruction in our world and in our lives.

A meaningful way of praying during Holy Week is simply to follow the labyrinth. All we have to do in our prayer is be open and receptive, content to follow and to receive what God chooses to give us. In this way our prayer enters into the way Christ lives. He allows himself to be taken on a journey by the Father. Thy will be done. So let scripture and reflections take you on this road. Be attentive to it. Notice its details. Entrust yourself to it.

From just this fall, we have seen increased registrations from 51 children to over 120, with many new families coming. That means we need to reframe how we are doing things because on any given Sunday we have classrooms that are at capacity. We need more leaders to expand into more spaces. Child Care Volunteers help on an as-needed basis when staff are unavailable, or we need to add adults to keep a safe adult/child ratio. WeeConnect and KidsConnect help on a rotating basis, approximately monthly, with a small team of other leaders.

**Note from Church Administrator, Gerry McShane: Our year is off to a great start thanks to many of you paying your annual pledge in full. Total revenue is up significantly due to non-pledged giving and per capita dues. YTD, non-pledged giving is up 39% vs budget while per capita shows a 44% increase Year-Over-Year. Expenses are lower due to timing differences in Personnel-related costs and property expenses. The latter is attributed to energy savings from warmer temperatures thus eliminating the need for snow removal, as well as savings from recent investments in LED lighting around the church. We are grateful for your generous heart!*
