



In its February 2024 meeting, the Session of Westminster approved a Strategic Visioning Lead Team to guide the congregation while working with ecumenical partners to discern God's call upon Westminster into the future.

The Strategic Visioning Lead Team, pictured above, met March 8-9 at The Welcoming Place, a retreat center of the Mennonite Central Committee. They were joined by facilitators Suzanne Farnham and Joe Gill from Listening Hearts Ministries in Baltimore, MD. Farnham and Gill led the Team in prayer, song, Scripture study, and creative spiritual practices. They also introduced guidelines for spiritual discernment, which will help Team members facilitate small group discussion and focus conversations in the congregation and community. The Center for Healthy Churches will also offer guidance. This Strategic Visioning process in 2024 is supported by a generous gift from an anonymous Westminster member, for which we are deeply grateful.

Last year marked five years since Westminster's previous work to develop "God-sized dreams:"

1. Expanding Our Witness
2. Serving Our Neighbors
3. Working toward Affordable Housing

4. Equipping the Emerging Generation

These dreams spurred investment of time, prayers, and efforts toward these long-term goals and relationships with community partners. The Team hopes to build on this work and expresses an openness to God's Spirit moving us forward in "knowing Christ, and making Christ known."

Rooted in our DNA as an adaptive congregation and part of the larger Reformed Christian tradition, we trust that God has a "future and a hope" (Jer 29:11) for Westminster, Christ's church in the world, and the whole of God's creation.

Message from our Church Administrator, Gerry McShane

February was another strong month as IRA QCD donations soared well beyond last February. To put it in perspective, IRAs represent 47% of YTD pledged giving, a significant jump over the prior year. A trend is developing where 50% of our giving now occurs in four months of the year, the first two and the last two. This makes it interesting in managing our cash flow. We have invested excess cash in bank CDs that provide returns of more than 5%, which has enhanced our other revenue. Our goal is to find other sources of revenue, facility use for example, to continue to supplement our primary revenue source. The Tromba Mundi concert provided us with \$1,000 in facility revenue in February. We have an excellent opportunity to host more of these type of concerts to take advantage of our beautiful space and ample parking as well as our partnership with WCU. Expenses have remained in check, with all ministry lines under budget, save for worship and arts and admin, and those are due to timing. Property Reserve investments for this year included the Spellman and front entrance portico roofs. This project is complete except for minor work. Our next big project will be replacing exterior doors and lower windows on the Sanctuary wing.
