

PHONE MINISTRY - Calling in for Worship is offered for those who want to listen to the 9:30 am service by phone. Contact Nancy Christy at 610-696-3284 for dialing instructions.

A REMOTE TV MONITOR is in the Quiet Room (just outside the sanctuary in the west hallway) to view and hear worship in progress for those with restless children or who need to leave the sanctuary.

HEARING ASSISTANCE DEVICES are available for worship at the Information Center in the Narthex. Additionally, the sanctuary is equipped with an induction loop system that transmits to hearing aids and cochlear implants with telecoils. **PEW CUSHIONS** also available at the Information Center.

KIDSCONNECT WILL resume in the Fall. **PRAY GROUNDS ARE LOCATED** along the sides of our Sanctuary and are geared towards young children to engage in items from the cart during services. Families are encouraged to utilize the additional children's materials in the Pray Grounds during worship over the summer.

While it appears we are right on track with our budget as I mentioned in last week's piece, it is important to point out that if we meet our expected revenue at year-end, we are still facing a deficit of at least \$120k. This assumes our expenses are on plan. The plan for this year was to take advantage of a healthy operating reserve of \$257k to absorb the deficit, while giving us time to determine the right staffing configuration and new revenue ideas for a changing faith landscape. Two areas we have addressed are the facility staffing needs with the hiring of another FT custodian and adding a PT finance assistant. As we head into the Fall, look for new developments in our overall strategic plan. *Gerry McShane, Church Administrator*

- \$3000 to the WPC Home Team sponsored by Burt Rothenberger, on behalf of the WPC Session. This will allow them to hire a 2024 summer intern to support affordable housing initiatives with the Chester County Partnership to End Homelessness.
